



Gender in proprietary software



IRC, mailing lists, forums, documentation, wiki...




Lurk first.

Don't give up on FLOSS!


If a project isn't fun anymore, there are plenty of others who'd love to have you on board.

If you're not, seek out other women in FLOSS.


